ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER: 04-08

AMENDED ORDER

Now on this 24 day of May, 2004, it is hereby ordered that:

- (1) The Public Defender is hereby appointed attorney for any person, now or hereafter detained or held in any facility of the Jackson County Family Court pursuant to the Interstate Compact on Juveniles, who has absconded, escaped, or run away from any parent, guardian, person, authority, or agency in any other state, provided if the Public Defender is unavailable, the Office of the Guardian ad Litem shall be appointed as attorney.
- (2) Appointment under this order is for the sole purpose of advising the person described in subsection (1) of his or her rights under the Interstate Compact On Juveniles and to assist such person in exercising said rights; however, if the person declines to waive their right to a hearing on the extradition of said person to the home state, the Public Defender or Guardian ad litem shall represent them in a hearing.
- (3) The Juvenile Officer or his designee shall, within four working hours after authorizing detention of a person described in subsection (1), notify the Public Defender or Guardian ad litem of such person's presence and shall provide copies of all documents and other information available, pertinent to said person, to the Public Defender or Guardian ad litem.

It is further ordered that Administrative Order 02-13 is hereby set aside and held for naught.
